Medford Township Information for COVID-19

Medford, NJ- Medford Township Office of Emergency Management is working closely with the Burlington County Office of Emergency Management and the Burlington County Health Department to respond to the Coronavirus emergency. Below are links and information for our residents to keep up to date on the most recent and vetted information. The following links provide access to our states 211 system, Register Ready website, Center for Disease Control, NJ State Department of Health, Burlington County Health Department, Medford Township Coronavirus information hub, and other resources.

Currently, the emphasis is on encouraging people to practice good health hygiene, including washing your hands frequently, covering coughs and sneezes, not touching your face, keep hand sanitizer close, and avoid sick people by staying home. It is important for individuals who exhibit signs or symptoms of the illness to not go out in the community. This includes avoiding work, school, religious services, and other social events while ill. If you have underlying health conditions such as heart disease, diabetes, lung disease, cancer, etc., talk to your doctor now and come up with a plan on what to do if you become sick.

What are the symptoms?

People who have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus have symptoms that may appear in as few as two days or as long as 14 days after exposure to the virus. Symptoms may include fever, cough, and shortness of breath.
